

We have agreed to help families for the holidays and I have received information from Willow. Here is a breakdown of each family and suggestions for gifts, as well as a list of food items we can give them. Please give generously and quickly - Christmas is just a few short weeks away. We have so much and these families so little!

Family 1: Female adult

Family 2: Female adult

Family 3: Female adult: this family is homeless or near homeless this year.

Family 4: Female adult: this family is also homeless or near homeless this year.

Family 5: Female adult

Male, 11 years old - likes dinosaurs Female, 13 years old - likes photography

Family 6: Male adult

Female, 10 years old - very girly

Family 7: Female adult

Female, 18 years old - scarves, journals, art supplies

Family 8: Female adult

Male, 7 years old Male, 14 years old Female, 10 years old

Family 9: Male adult and female adult (Cancer patient)

Male, 13 years old Male, 14 years old

Family 10: Male adult and female adult (All are Spanish speaking only)

Female, 13 years old Female, 2 years old Female, 4 years old Male, 8 years old



Adults: necessities like sweaters, sweatshirts, socks, slippers, gloves, bath towels, thermals, tote bags, kitchen towels, scarves. **Children**: colored pencils, pencils, drawing paper, writing paper, sets of crayons. Also socks, sweatshirts, slippers. The information I have is listed above, but there are many items that can be great gifts for these kids - dolls, action figures, LEGOs, small lamps, gift certificates for clothing, backpacks, etc. **Food**: bags of rice and beans, boxes of macaroni and cheese, apple sauce, pudding cups, string cheese, turkeys (if we can get donations from a grocery store), canned veggies, soups, energy bars, granola, Top Ramon. Non-perishable is preferred and we may want to give all families a 5lb. bag of potatoes, as well as cheese, butter, etc.

Donated items can be brought to Club or delivered to Anne's house at 508 Jones Street. If you need help, call Anne at 462-1901 - she may be able to pick up for you. We have 3 weeks to gather everything, so please donate quickly!
